BOUNTY LAND CLAIM.

FORM OF DECLARATION FOR SURVIVING OFFICER OR SOLDIER.

State of Indiana
County of Bartholomew } ss.

On this Twenty-eighth day of June A. D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, personally appeared before me, Chilton A. Terrell a Notary Public, duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County and State aforesaid, John Cooley aged Sixty-Six years, a resident of Bartholomew County in the State of Indiana who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical John Cooley who was a private in the Company commanded by Captain Hiram C. Boone in the Regiment of Indiana Militia commanded by Colonel Jordan in guarding the Indiana frontier from the incursions of the Indians declared by the United States on the 18th June 1812 in the war with Great Britain (and the Indians) that he was drafted at Beck's Mills, Harrison Co. Ind. on or about the first day of September A. D. 1812 for the term of Three months and continued in actual service in said war for the term of thirty-five days and was honorably discharged at Vincennes Indiana on the Sixth day of October A. D. 1812 on account of being no longer needed & by orders of the Governor of Indiana Territory as will appear by the muster rolls of said Company.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he may be entitled under the "act granting additional bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," approved March 3, 1855. And refers to his former declaration made under act of September 28, 1850 upon which he obtained a Land Warrant No. (forgotten), for Forty acres, which he having legally transferred and disposed of, is not within his power now to return.

He further declares that he has not received a warrant for bounty land, under any other act of Congress, nor made any application therefor, than the one above referred to, under act of Sept. 28, 1850 upon which he obtained the said Land Warrant, No. (forgotten), for Forty acres, and the one now presented. (The words "in guarding the Indiana frontier from the incursions of the Indians," interlined before signing.)

- Then will follow after the words "that he" whether the officer, or soldier, enlisted, volunteered, or was drafted.
- If the claimant has presented his discharge with his former application which he made under any former acts, or had no discharge, let him state the facts in this declaration.
- If the soldier rendered service in different wars, let him set forth each service fully in his declaration.
- The affidavit of two witnesses must be taken to establish the identity of the claimant.

On this fourteenth day of November A D one thousand eight hundred and fifty personally appeared before me the undersigned a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid John Cooley aged sixty one years a resident of Washington County in the State of Indiana who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the identical John Cooley who was a private in the Company commanded by Captain Abram C Boon (the name of the regiment not recalled) in the Regiment ^{of Indiana Militia} commanded by Col ~~ord~~ Jordan in the War ~~declared~~ with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18th day of June 1812 and that he was drafted at Rush Mills in Washington County Indiana on or about the 15th day of August 1812 for the Term of three months and continued in actual service in said War for the Term of thirty five days when he was discharged to guard the frontier and was honorably discharged at Bennetts in Knox County Indiana about the last of September 1812 and that he never received any written discharge but his service will appear by the muster rolls of said Company He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty land to which he may be entitled under the act granting Bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States passed September 28th 1850
